All matters that may be normally considered by the Commission may be taken up and acted on at such meetings.

At this time, Mayor Holder recognized General Sessions Court Judge, John Walton, present in the audience. Judge Walton addressed the Commissioner: as a result of a motion that was passed at the June County Commission meeting directing the Special Investigations Committee to look into the services provided by Cross-Roads as well as their policies, procedures, fees charged for their services and where that money goes. Judge Walton explained that what is now called Cross-Roads was established in May 1973 and was registered with the IRS as a 501(3)(c) nonprofit organization and required to follow strict regulations to maintain certification. He explained that the fees charged by Cross-Roads had increased in January 2007 from \$25.00 plus a \$2.00 Clerk's fee to \$32.00 plus a \$3.00 Clerk's fee and that the fees charged by the Clerk went to the County. He stated that the Constitutions of the United States and the State of Tennessee provided for the separation of powers and in his opinion the County Commission, the legislative branch, had no authority to investigate a nonprofit agency working for the juducial branch. He displayed his displeasure with the investigation by calling it a "Witch Hunt" that resulted in giving Cross-Roads an undeserved black eye in the community. At the request of the Special Investigations Committee, Judge Walton agreed to be present at their next meeting.

Under Public Comments on the agenda, Ken Arney recognized Roy
Livingston who questioned the proper steps to be taken for the County to
pass a Private Act, specifically the one passed to create the Watauga River
Regional Water Authority. His opinion was that the proper procedure had not
been followed and the WRRWA was illegal. Nancy Brown recognized George
Papantoniou who voiced his concern over the Rescue Squad's charges for their
services. Robert Davis invited Papantoniou to attend the next Rescue Squad
Board meeting on August 21, 2007. Nancy Brown recognized Glenn McCloud who
was dissatisfied with the county's funding of the Sheriff's Department stating
he had been vandalized and threatened by juveniles in his neighborhood
and the Sheriff's Department was much needed for his protection.

Motion was made by Steve Lowrance, seconded by Robert Davis to amend the agenda to allow Don Hurst, President of Carter County Tomorrow, to report on economic development. Mr. Hurst discussed his plans for economic growth in Carter County stating that you have got to focus on your infrastructure and your water. He stated that he would be coming back to tell the Commission

what is required to do business in the 21st century and would be attending the County Commission each month as well as City Council, Planning Commission, School Board meetings and any and all meetings he was able to attend.

On motion by Lynn Tipton, seconded by Lawrence Hodge the minutes of the July 16, 2007 County Commission were approved by voice roll call vote this August 20, 2007.

The appointment of a Coroner was deferred at the request of the County Attorney who informed the Commission that Carter County is required to have a Medical Examiner. He recommended that the Coroner position not be filled but a Medical Examiner be appointed instead.
