On motion by Lynn Tipton, seconded by Jerry Pearman the minutes of the April 20, 2009, meeting of the County Commission were approved as presented by voice roll call vote.

Chief Deputy Ron Street informed the Commission that the Sheriff's Department wanted to apply for a Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant in the amount of \$23,974. He stated that a public hearing was required before the Commission could vote to approve the application for this grant. He further stated that there were no "matching funds" required for the grant. Motion was made and seconded to recess into a public hearing to discuss the matter. As there were no comments from the Commissioners or public, court was called back to order. Motion was made by Jerry Pearman, seconded by Robert Gobble to approve the Sheriff's Department to make application for this grant. By voice roll call vote, motion duly carried.

At this time Mayor Holder recognized the elected officials in the audience by asking them to stand.

Under Public Comments on the agenda, Robert Gobble recognized Pete Ensor. Mr. Ensor took the floor to ask the Commissioners for their vote for Dallas Ornduff as Constable of the 7th District and Jerry Miller as Constable of the 8th District to fill vacancies in those districts.

Roy Livingston reflected on the Land Fill and the missing \$10,000 in fuel stating that a close eye needed to be kept on this situation by everyone. In defense of the Landfill Committee, Richard Tester stated that this situation was currently being investigated and that a variety of options were being discussed concerning the landfill issues. He further stated that once the necessary data is compiled they would move forward with a decision. Mr. Livingston then stated that in his opinion Mayor Holder owed a public apology to the Commissioner he told did not know what he was talking about regarding the 81 Act and the fact that purchasing anything without first getting a purchase order was in violation of this Act. Mayor Holder responded by saying, "that's your opinion".

Carter County Tomorrow President Don Hurst gave a brief update at this time. He commended Commissioner Ritchie for his suggestion at the last meeting to have attractive signs welcoming visitors for our County put at each entrance to Carter County.

Bill Armstrong informed the Commissioners that the Budget Committee Sheriff's Department workshop would be on May 28, 2009, at 6 pm.

County Attorney Keith Bowers addressed the issue with ThyssenKrupp Elevator Group regarding the maintenance contract for the courthouse elevators. He stated that ThyssenKrupp was of the opinion that their contract with the County automatically renewed. He was of the opinion that the contract had been breached when ThyssenKrupp admitted to overcharging the County. He stated the County planned to terminate and rebid the contract.

Steve Lowrance informed the Commission that the County owned considerable parcels of land that could be sold as a source of revenue. He suggested that a committee look into selling some of the land. The County Attorney said that the situation was already being investigated but that it was preferred to delay any action until after the Sheriff's lawsuit was settled.

Lynn Tipton asked that Nancy Brown be publicly recognized for recently completing more than 100 hours to become a Certified Public Administrator. Mayor Holder, who had also been certified, congratulated Commissioner Brown, stating the course was beneficial in performing their service to the county now and in the future.

Under Commissioner comments, Richard Tester once again stressed the fact the there was an ongoing investigation by the Sheriff's Department regarding the landfill issues and that it was unfair to accuse the Commission of doing nothing. He further stated that no decision had been made on leasing out the landfill. Jeff McKinney suggested that if the demolition part of the landfill was not ___ breaking even then it maybe should be closed down. Tom Bowers asked that a Client/Attorney meeting be held after the meeting adjourned. Gebe Ritchie questioned why any department's budget should have to be cut when there had been \$16,878,936 of new appraisals in the County up until May 2009. He questioned when this would be put on the tax rolls and stated that the 4% budget cut should be put to rest awhile. Ken Arney questioned the County Attorney

as to whether or not the County was being sued over the Peters' property next to the Courthouse. He assumed that the lawsuit did not involve the County as it was against the former Clerk and Master, Charlotte McKeehan. Attorney Bowers informed him that unless the suit was filed directly against an individual, then a suit directed to any county office therefore involved the county.

In an effort to "just be on the safe side", motion was made by Bill Armstrong seconded by Gebe Ritchie to have a roll call vote on the approval for a grant application by the Sheriff's Department previously approved by a voice roll call vote. Roll call vote as follows:
