- 3. The bonus payment is calculated based on the annual base salary of all employees. Comp time or overtime payments are not included in the calculation. Part-time employee's average pay was used to calculate their annual pay due to the variation in their wages each week. Three percent (3%) of the total payroll was divided by the number of employees to get the final amount.
- 4. All eligible employees will receive a bonus payment in the gross amount of seven hundred fifty five dollars (\$755.00); however, those employees who contribute to TCRS will have the appropriate deduction calculated on their check while those who do not contribute to TCRS will not.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Resolution in its entirety shall be effective from and after its adoption, the welfare of the county demanding.
