Johnny Holder, County Chairman Carter County, Tennessee

Motion was made by Jerry Pearman, seconded by Jeff McKinney to accept the minutes from the March 16, 2009, meeting of the Commission as presented. By voice roll call vote, motion duly carried.

Students from area high schools known as the "Clean Team" were introduced to the Commissioners at this time. Marisa Potter explained that these students had composed songs and dances to perform for 4th and 5th graders in the elementary schools which would make them conscious of the need to stop littering.

Under Public Comments, Roy Livingston commented on the dollars missing from the landfill and urged all taxpayers to keep an eye on this situation. Linda Whitehead, owner of the Carter at Main Restaurant across the street from the jail questioned how the county intended to handle the parking situation created by the new jail construction. Apparently people have been using the parking lot at her business for courthouse business. She stated that she would be re-opening the restaurant again and would not be responsible or liable for persons using her parking lot that were not patrons of the restaurant.

Carter County Tomorrow President Don Hurst reported that STL Distribution, the world's largest distributor of Christian literature, would be locating in the Frank Shaffer building. He stated that they would employ about 150 workers but as they would be moving a number of their present employees, he was not sure how many Carter Countians would be hired.

At this time Mayor Holder addressed allegations made by Nancy Brown at the April meeting that money was being spent out of the Maintenance Fund improperly. She stated that snacks, drinks and other questionable items were being purchased and displayed receipts showing this. Mayor Holder explained that such items were purchased for the inmates that worked at the courthouse and in fact the county was saving approximately \$94,000 a year by not having to pay wages to an employee for the work that the inmates do. He also stated that a receipt discovered by Commissioner Brown for a plastic jeep in the amount of \$1.57 actually pertained to a key made at Wal-Mart for a vehicle.
