A presentation was given at this time by Sheila Hunt, Director of Archives/Tourism for Sullivan County who gave an overview of the Archive Department in her county. She explained the process and phases of organizing the archives and stated Carter County may want to consider their method of maintaining government records. She stated that "tourism" was attached to her title because the archives had attracted some 1800 to 2000 people to their county in past years. The Mayor said if the resolution tabled at the last meeting to implement an archives fee on various documents was passed in the future, these fees would be used to create an archives department. He asked the commissioners to weigh this situation seriously.

Under Public Comments Mack Cook, a local car dealer, voiced his opposition to an additional archives fees stating these fees would just be another waste of money.

Scott Snell addressed the commission once again on the illegal hook up of a trailer in his district on Arlington Drive. He asked the commissioners of his district if they had any new information for him and Ms. Blankenship stated she had seen vehicles and other signs that would lead you to believe the trailer was occupied. Chris Schuettler said a court order was in the hands of the County Attorney regarding this matter. Mr. Snell was referred to the County Attorney for answers.

Jean Ray addressed the commission asking why the county was maintaining cemetery roads but doing nothing to repair Dennis Cove Road. Joel Street informed Ms. Ray he had inspected that road with Mr. Miller and was assured

they would begin to patch the road but to resurface the entire road would cost the county too much money. She stated if money was so tight in the county she felt that roads traveled daily should be maintained before cemetery roads.

Paul Tolley informed the commissioners the Park & Recreation Committee had been raising money and applying for grants to build a skate board park in Roan Mountain and he felt these people deserved a skate park that was safe and no liability to anyone. He also told the commissioners people were using the property across from Hampton High School for a dump site and they needed to do something about it.

Roy Livingston told the commissioners and the audience they needed to be following a segment the Elizabethton Star was running concerning the jail construction. He said everyone always thought the county was under a Federal Court order to build the jail but they may find out the real story by reading the Star's articles.

Steve Raga asked how many change orders there had been since the jail project began. The Mayor told him there had been two change orders he knew of, one for contract extension through October 6, 2010, and the other was the allocation of \$100,000 to finish out the smoke evac system and guardrail installation. He then voiced his dislike for Blaine Construction.

Roberta Whitehead informed the commissioners and the audience if the voters of Carter County did not like the job the elected officials were doing they had no one to blame but themselves because they were the ones that put them in office. She suggested if they were unhappy with them they needed to make some changes next election.

Charlie McQueen stated the 8th district had been left out when it came to fire departments. Commissioner Blankenship related to Mr. McQueen the fire departments in the county were all volunteer but the city fire departments' employees had to be paid from city funds. He further inquired if the \$22,500 approved to be given to the city for the operation of the Parks & Rec had been paid and commended Chris Schuettler on a job well done in the Planning Department.

Carter County Tomorrow President Tom Anderson reported at this time stating tourism in May brought some 250 visitors to the Chamber of Commerce. He said a Marketing Committee had been organized to bring new creative ways to market the area. He stated Project Quest and Project Red Energy were still viable and Project Smokey Mountain had chosen Elizabethton to locate offering 30 new manufacturing jobs in the county this summer. He told the commission infrastructure issues were being discussed regarding the old Inland Container building and the engineering had been completed on the State Industrial Access Route to the Watauga Industrial Park. He said TDOT had agreed to do the signalization on Judge Ben Allen and Don Lewis Roads, State Route 91, at the

same time as the industrial access route. He informed the commissioners a USDA World Business Enterprise grant in the amount of \$17,500 had been received and would be used for an Elizabethton sign enhancement project.

He said Mr. Rogers stated the jail had passed with flying colors on the smoke removal test and the State would be issuing a Certificate of Occupancy upon receipt of a letter from his office and the report from the company that supervised the smoke

removal testing. The Mayor said there were several issues outstanding as far as the punch list, however, Mr. Rogers' position was the date of substantial completion should now be set at June 14. He stated he took issue with that and would not sign the document. Several punch list items were discussed as well as outstanding invoices that had been presented for payment. Jo Ann Blankenship stated she wanted to make them all aware she had contacted the Mayor and the County Attorney regarding the legal aspects concerning warranty expirations on equipment at the jail.

Reporting for the Buildings & Grounds Committee, the Mayor stated that on October 1, 2007, the Tennessee Legislature passed a Non-smoker Protection Act making nearly every work place in the State smoke free by law. He outlined the procedures for complying with the Act and the penalties for failure to comply. He stated the Act pertains to public buildings and the county is currently in compliance.

Reporting for the Buildings & Grounds Committee, the Mayor said he had been contacted by the tenants in the Public Defender's office concerning problems with electrical circuits. He stated the building was originally a residence not set up for business use and things were going to have to be done, especially in the summer season. He said the circuits were being overloaded and the overcurrent protectors were being tripped thus creating a potential fire hazard. He said he had received an estimate for the installation of three new circuits of approximately \$600. Motion was made by Ronnie Trivett, seconded by Paul Mottern to install 3 new circuits from the service panel to the upstairs office at a cost not to exceed \$600 funds coming from the Buildings & Grounds budget. He said the overloading of the circuits put not only that building at risk but also the new jail. He said he had received an estimate in the amount of \$4,340 for the installation of a 100 amp sub-panel between the two office areas, installing circuits from the new panel to eight power data poles as well as adding two circuits in the heavy use areas along the block wall. Motion was made by Ronnie Trivett, seconded by L. C. Tester to approve the installation of the sub-panel and all the work that goes along with it.

The Mayor stated he had only a position on the Planning Board and felt he should not be the one to sign documents involving lawsuits. Under Commissioner Comments, Ken Arney presented the following letter to the Clerk which he read to the commission and asked it to be made a part of the minutes. Commissioner Arney's letter entered on page 202. John Lewis made a motion to exempt all wooden bridges from the Zoning Regulations, but failed to get a second. Nancy Brown questioned the number of employees the Sheriff had at the jail compared to the number employed at Northeast State

Correctional Facility. Sonja Culler referred to minutes of the May 2, 2011, Rules/By-Laws committee meeting. Motion passed during said meeting to put Public Comments just before Commissioner Comments on the agenda. Ms. Culler asked why we aren't going by the committee's recommendations. Mayor responded that the committee did not fully discuss the issue of public comments and to put public comments near the end of the agenda would prohibit citizens from addressing agenda items prior to any action being taken by the commission. Commissioner Blankenship stated she had based her motion on the duties of the County Clerk listed in the document the Mayor had presented to the commission at a prior meeting which called for the Clerk to prepare the agenda. She stated the agenda listed in this document did not include Public Comments at all. The Mayor stated not putting Public Comments on the agenda was cutting off the people's rights. Entered below is the letter submitted by Ken Arney.

June 20, 2011

Fellow Commissioners, citizens of the sixth district and Carter County; in August of 2010, I was elected to represent the citizens of the sixth district as their commissioner. In the previous four years that I served, I found a deficiency in the landfill, representing thousands of dollars. Continuing to work diligently in this term of office, I found that the probation office and the public defender's office had not paid rent to Carter County for the past twenty-two years. These state offices pay rent in other counties. After much work, this zero return on leased property now brings in a little more than \$1200 a month into the coffers of Carter County. Since February of 2011, the sixth district has been very limited in their representation because of my inability to voice an opinion into discussions and moves made in the Commission. Since February of 2011, my civil rights have been violated twice, thus limiting my ability to represent my district fairly as an elected official.

All county officials and employees deserve a secure workplace without harassment, sexual harassment, slander, or the threat of bodily harm. The statement that we need to learn to breathe deeply does not apply as a measure of security. It is the responsibility of the city, county, state, and federal officers to uphold the safety of the county employees, officials, and all citizens. The opening statement of the Chair indicates that no personal attacks will be allowed in the Commission meeting. Apparently, this statement applies only to commissioners, not to others.

With this said, I appreciate the opportunity to address this Commission and the people of Carter County.




