"A RESOLUTION HONORING THE SERVICE OF UNITED STATES ARMY STAFF SERGEANT BILLY JOE ELLIS AND DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE SPANNING BUFFALO CREEK LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 359 IN THE HAPPY VALLEY COMMUNITY OF CARTER COUNTY AS THE "STAFF SERGEANT BILLY JOE ELLIS MEMORIAL BRIDGE"

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Billy Joe Ellis served with distinction as a member of Company D, 2nd Battalion, 12th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division in the United States Army during the Vietnam war; and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 1968 Staff Sergeant Ellis' unit came under heavy mortar and small arms attack by the Viet Cong while performing operations at a landing zone. Although he was presumed Killed in Action (KIA), after the conclusion of the attack his body was never recovered. He was subsequently officially declared Missing in Action (MIA) by the United States government; and

WHEREAS, due to these circumstances the family of Staff Sergeant Ellis never obtained any definitive answers or closure regarding his death or disappearance. Unfortunately, Betty Ellis, Staff Sergeant Ellis' mother, passed away never knowing exactly what fate befell her son; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Ellis gave the ultimate sacrifice in service to our country, and he served with honor while defending our freedom and our way of life so that we could continue to live in peace here at home; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Ellis was a native of Carter County having been born and raised in the Happy Valley Community of Carter County and graduating from Happy Valley High School; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission of Carter County would like to formally recognize and honor the sacrifice made by Staff Sergeant Ellis by adopting this Resolution in his honor and requesting the State of Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) to officially designate the bridge on State Route 359 spanning Buffalo Creek located just below Happy Valley High School in the Happy Valley Community of Carter County as the "Staff Sergeant Billy Joe Ellis Memorial Bridge".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of Carter County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this the 17th day of November, 2014, with a lawful quorum of said Commission being present and with a majority voting in the affirmative as follows:

- 1. That the County Commission of Carter County, Tennessee hereby adopts this Resolution honoring Staff Sergeant Billy Joe Ellis so that we may always remember the sacrifice he made and the price he paid for the freedom we enjoy today not only as residents of this county, but also as citizens of this great nation.
- 2. That the County Commission of Carter County, Tennessee hereby respectfully requests that the State Representatives for Carter County take the appropriate action on behalf of Carter County to ensure that the bridge on State Route 359 spanning Buffalo Creek located just below Happy Valley High School in the Happy Valley Community of Carter County is officially designated as the "Staff Sergeant Billy Joe Ellis Memorial Bridge", and to ensure that said bridge shall always bear the name of Staff Sergeant Ellis regardless of the future necessity for replacement of said bridge.
